Rising Cost of Trade, Longest Lead Times in Multiple Sectors


Severe Demand-Supply Mismatch, Supply Side Eco-System Collapse


#### Demand

- Factory shut downs COVID-19, energy
- Severe Disruption in Transportation Eco-System – Ports, Roads, Air Cargo, Maritime, Crew, Labor






## **Supply Side Constraints**

Is the Worst Over? Air Capacity in Some Key Lanes Down





# Transport heads joint call on world leaders to secure global supply chains

The impact of nearly two years' worth of strain, placed particularly upon maritime and road transport workers, but also impacting air crews, is now being seen. Their continued mistreatment is adding pressure on an already crumbling global supply chain. We are witnessing unprecedented disruptions and global delays and shortages on essential goods including electronics, food, fuel and medical supplies. Consumer demand is rising and the delays look set to worsen ahead of Christmas and continue into 2022.

#### Willie Walsh, IATA Director General said:

"Over the past 18 months, aviation workers have been amazingly resilient in keeping world trade lanes open. It's been made unnecessarily challenging with uncoordinated, unharmonized and sometimes conflicting COVID-19 measures implemented by governments. This is not sustainable, particularly as demand grows in the recovery. It's time for WHO and ILO to bring states together to agree a globally harmonized set of crew measures that will facilitate efficient global connectivity."
